3 Secrets to Learn Tarot Reading in Under 1 Hour (Without Needing a Guidebook)

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Instantly Connect with Tarot Card Meanings Without Memorizing

It took me over thirty years to discover how to condense the supernatural and psychological art of Tarot into something you can learn in under one hour. It is a unique form of divination because it uses a set game-like structure that originated in the 15th century as an actual (bridge-like) card game called Tarocchi.

Tarot evolved over the centuries as a tool to help you connect "beyond the veil." The rules changed, but learning Tarot still starts with having an understanding of how to play. The Universe (which you may refer to as Spirit, Angel Guides, Extrasensory Psychic Gifts, Divine Force, God, Goddess, etc.) uses the constructs of the game to communicate with you. You need this base foundation, whether from reading a book, attending a local class, or using my Tarot podcast that takes less than an hour. It begins with the first secret all great Tarot readers know...

SECRET #1: YOU MUST CONNECT WITH THE CARDS IN A STORY FORMAT.

Tarot is storytelling, so we call it "reading." Whether you pull one card or many cards, all stories have characters and events in some stage of beginning, middle, or end. And each Tarot card represents a character at an event's beginning, middle, or end. The characters and events depicted by the 78-cards represent 1) the person you are reading for, 2) someone close to them, or 3) a hidden aspect within them that needs to be acknowledged before they can reach their goal. You must be familiar enough with the characteristics of each card to use a specific card to identify the real-life person or event the story is about. But it can be challenging initially to keep all 78 cards straight without referencing a guidebook.


You need to know about five key domains to connect to the cards instantly and without a guidebook. Then you need a great beginner deck that visually connects you to these domains. The decks I design use proven keywords and symbols to do this. But whether you use my <u>Tarot deck</u> or a different one is unimportant. As long as you have good visual

clues to the five domains printed on each card, you will not need to reference a guidebook to understand the card's meaning.

Domain 1: Archetypes Recognize who the story is about by the behaviors of the character/s.

An archetype is a commonly recognized human behavior (manifesting as a person or event) that anyone can relate to

regardless of their relative age, culture, education, social, economic, or other background. There are hundreds of archetypal characters, each with identifying qualities and personality patterns that make them easy to relate to, such as "the hero," "the outlaw," "the ruler," "the wise sage," etc. While



memorizing each card is unnecessary, you must know which human behavior each card represents. My <u>Tarot decks</u> use keywords printed on each card to help you.

Domain 2: Numerology Identify the stage of the events/s in the story (beginning, middle, or end).

There are twenty-two Major Arcana cards. These cards represent the long-term consequences of choices and events that become significant life lessons. The positional number of the Major Arcana represents a journey from beginning to end, starting with The Fool, number 0, and ending with The World, number 21.

Fifty-six Minor Arcana cards represent shorter-term consequences from routine, daily life experiences. Minor Arcana are subdivided into four suits with ten numbered cards (PIP cards) and Court Cards (Pages, Knights, Queens, and Kings). The positional number of the card in the deck has an associated meaning for the minor arcana PIP cards (ace to 10).

The PIP card's position in the deck hints at the cradle-to-grave concept of the card's meaning in the spread. Lesser cards are at the beginning, and greater numbers are at the end of something. And by remembering a few keywords for each number, you can quickly get a hint at the relevance of the number to the story in the spread. For example:

Beginning

The term for beginning in Tarot-Astrology is "Cardinal"

- Aces in the Tarot indicate a time of great potential.
- 2s in the Tarot indicate a time to make a **choice**.
- 3s in the Tarot indicate a time of **growth**.
- 4s in the Tarot ask you to compare your current situation to what's most important to you.

Middle

The term for middle in Tarot-Astrology is "Fixed"

The problem with being in the middle of something is that we tend to believe things will stay the same forever. This is never true.

- 5s in the Tarot indicate a time of struggle.
- 6s in the Tarot indicate a time to balance the good with the bad.
- 7s in the Tarot indicate that it is time to reflect on beliefs.

End

The term for end in Tarot-Astrology is "Mutable"

- 8s in the Tarot are associated with the time that led up to a current level of expertise.
- 9s in the Tarot indicate a time of consequences for past actions.
- 10s in the Tarot indicate one cycle is completing and a new one will soon start.

The positional number of the card in the deck has an associated meaning for the minor arcana court cards related to maturity (not necessarily actual age.)

- Pages in the Tarot indicate a childlike time of new discovery.
- Knights in the Tarot indicate a young adult's time of intense effort.
- Queens in the Tarot indicate a mature time of powerful feelings.
- Kings in the Tarot indicate a mature time of strong dependability.

Domain 3: Classic Elements

Pick up on the motivations that influence the character or event.

Knowing the classical elements assigned to each card will help you quickly leap to the core of the card's meaning, which may be about thinking, doing, feeling, or securing. My <u>Tarot decks</u> use symbols on each card to help you immediately see which elements are associated with a card.

AIR - Thinking

Air is associated with thinking, intellect, and intelligence. It is often denoted with white, blue, or purple coloring on a card. The suit of swords and all four pages are associated with air. In a reading, if you pull an air card, you are dealing with the part of a story that has to do with someone's thoughts (intellect and strategy).

FIRE - Doing

Fire is associated with doing, action, and movement. It is often denoted with red or yellow coloring on a card. The suit of wands and all four knights are associated with fire. A fire card addresses the part of the story that requires desire and actions (the physical work in the doing of something).

EARTH - Securing

Earth is associated with securing what you need, responsibilities, and dependability. It is often denoted with green or brown coloring on a card. The suit of coins and all four kings are associated with earth. An earth card is the part

of the story that requires physical security (responsibility and obligations.)

WATER – Feeling

emotions).

Water is associated with emotion and feelings. It is often denoted with blue coloring on a card. The suit of cups and all four queens are associated with water. A water card addresses how the people in the story feel or felt (love and

Domain 4: Astrology Use astrology to see the personality traits that are shaping the event.

Tarot and astrology can together provide enhanced



insights into spiritual readings. Astrology studies a person's birthdate and the influence of planetary positions and

movements on their personality traits. The Rider-Waite deck was created in 1909 and is still the most popular deck ever sold. It was heavily influenced by astrology as defined by a secret organization called the Hermetic Order of the Golden Dawn. My <u>Tarot decks</u> use symbols printed on each card to help you.

PLANETS AND PERSONALITY TRAITS

Planetary influences are assigned to some cards based on the seven planets that could be seen from earth in the late 1800s. My <u>Tarot decks</u> use symbols on each card to help you immediately see which planets are associated with a card. And my decks use different symbols to identify the traditional planets and scientific symbols to identify the modern planets so psychics connecting with ancestral souls don't have to guess which rules should be applied.



Domain 5: Intuition

Feed your Intuition to better connect with the story.

Science has proven that our intuition connects us to a higher level of consciousness. And research shows that our intuition hits us on a physical level first, which preps the consciousness to catch up. Your gastrointestinal tract has 100 million neurons. This network of nerve cells lining the digestive tract is so extensive that it is referred to as our "second brain." So, getting a "gut feeling," butterflies in your tummy, or stomach pains is how you get notified by your subconscious to pay attention to something.

SECRET #2: INTUITION ALONE IS NOT ENOUGH. HERE'S WHAT IS.

On the other hand, imagination is the art of considering what should be done with the input our intuition gives us. Some people, such as empaths and psychics, do this effortlessly. Imagination is a natural skill children possess. We tend to forget how to use our imagination as we age. Rather than immediately deciding how you feel about a card based solely

on the face value of the card, allow yourself to consider the possible "what-ifs" the card could represent. Allow yourself to think in an unusual, unique, or novel way.

The more intuition (input) your imagination has to work with, the more robust your reading will be. Hacking your intuition to get that data is surprisingly simple.

Notice the energy around you.

Some people don't properly regulate their energy and have adapted by taking yours. Many don't even know they are doing it. Our "Querents" (the people we are reading for) come in all shapes and sizes of spiritual health. The best way to help

them is to protect your energy levels and the messages the cards want to deliver. Keep your vibrations steady by setting

your intention with an affirmation. Example: "My energy is rooted to the earth and fused to the universe, in such abundance that it can't run low."

Get yourself in the right place.

Being in the right place is more than just an incense-infused physical space. Mindfulness is our ability to be fully present, aware of where we are and what we're doing, and accept it. You can ruin the message intended by the cards if you are worried about the past or are rushing to get to the future. Take a deep breath. Breathing in "peace and calm." Exhaling out "tension and anxiety."

Embrace your innate worth.

There are no rules more important than what feels right to you. What's "right" for you may be a big no-no for me. For example, some will never let Querents touch their cards, while others use their touch to detect psychic imprints and have no problem clearing that energy between uses. If it feels right to you, it is correct.

You don't need to understand the ins and outs of rituals or magic(k) customs to feed your intuition with your imagination. You need to believe in the power inside of yourself. Tap into and embrace what you believe most in (religions and other forms of divination). Different vibrational rates and energy patterns happen when you focus on your beliefs, expectations, motivations, and intentions. Look in the mirror and remind yourself that you are a person of worth.

Get Correct Answers in Every Reading

The best outcomes happen when you ask great questions that can help you better understand the Querent and help them think about the possible reason for the card. The future is in constant flux with every new action in the present; the future is altering and rearranging.

SECRET #3: ASK THE RIGHT QUESTION TO GET CORRECT ANSWERS EVERY TIME

Tarot cards show the progression of the present as it evolved from the past and, therefore, the probable path to the future.

It predicts future events because when you introspect on card meanings and their implications against a desired goal, you actively reshape the future with your new insights. Great Tarot readers know that the magic doesn't come from outside the Querent; it comes from the mindset and manifestation within the Querent.

Asking great questions helps you and your Querent frame the best future outcome and prevents you from "going blank."

Prevent "Going Blank"

No matter your intuition and experience, it's easy to lose confidence when the cards don't make sense. Don't get thrown for a loop! The inclination to reshuffle and try again due to self-doubt is something to avoid because it undermines the reader and the process. Many mediums believe it is disrespectful to the spirit guides to ask a question a second time because you don't like or understand the answer. When the cards seem wrong, it is time to **ask questions**.

Start with the right question.

An answer is only as good as the question asked. When you consider too many questions or an unspecific question, the cards can reflect an equally garbled response. One way to avoid this is to help your Querent consider a good question before shuffling the cards.

Asking a question that requires a simple yes or no response is often anticlimactic and unfulfilling. The future is in constant flux with every new action in the present; the future is altering and rearranging. Therefore, a "yes" or "no" reading will only show what a probable outcome is. It will not help you influence the result you want.

The solution is to encourage your Querent to ask open-ended questions. For example: "How can I find my soulmate?" versus "Will I find my soulmate?" If this is not possible for the Querent, a general reading is better (an open-ended reading with no specific question in mind.) Another benefit of a general reading is that it allows the Universe to address the right story, which might not be what the Querent thinks it is.

Connect the Querent to the story using a meaningful question.

The Universe wants the Querent to connect with the reason for the cards. Asking powerful questions will help you get them there. For example, THE FOOL is a card that embodies the innocent beginning of a life-defining adventure. It is about beginnings that are sometimes fearless and sometimes fearful. Get your Querent in the right headspace by asking: Why is "going for it" important to you (or not)? See the index at the back of this book for BONUS CONTENT question examples.

Finally, remember that no answer is sometimes the correct answer. Your Querent may need to know more about the current moment to use it as a basis to clarify a future outcome. It is not unusual for a Querent to return weeks after a reading that did not resonate with them then, only to declare it was apparent to them later. Explain to your Querent that the future may become clouded when the present is rapidly unfolding. We are only sometimes meant to have an immediate answer.

The Top 10 Mistakes New Tarot Card Readers Make

Certain situations arise in Tarot readings that can take you by surprise if you are not expecting them. Be aware of the following to avoid problems!

1. Selecting the wrong deck.

A well-illustrated deck will quickly communicate universally recognized symbols of thought. My <u>Tarot decks</u> use keywords and symbols printed on each card to help you immediately see which elements are associated with

You should select a deck based on what feels right for you.

a card.

2. Misunderstanding age and gender.

Some cards are grammatically gendered or depict age.

They do not refer to actual biological gender or physical

years. Masculine and feminine traits and maturity levels exist in all of us.

3. Reading cards at the wrong time.

None of us can be our perfect and best version every day. You may be mentally distracted, hungry, without enough sleep, or not firing on all your usual cylinders. If you are not in the right frame of mind, putting the cards down for a while is better. Also, do not read the cards if you are taking certain medications or are under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

4. Thinking there are bad cards.

Some of the best cards to get in a reading are also the scariest because they foretell suffering. Newer readers often try to make light of a negative card because it's hard to be the bearer of bad news. But, to do this is a great disservice in most cases. Minimizing the story in the spread can rob the session of its ability to share a life lesson and help the querent find the most beneficial mindset for any needed problem-solving.

5. Handling skeptics.

It is not unusual to have a skeptical Querent say: "If you are psychic, prove it to me!" When this happens, asking the querent to explain why they feel as they do can be helpful. Some skeptics come from a position of uncertainty and just want to be proved wrong. They are afraid of getting conned.

6. Managing verbal attacks.

People can fear what they don't understand, which can look a lot like fury. Some people feel Tarot reading is an affront to their religious or moral beliefs and will attack a reader on social media or sometimes at parties or events a reader is working at. For most of these people, no amount of reasoning will change their minds. To help diffuse attacks, let the person know you will not fight them and try to understand their feelings. Let go of your need to be correct, have thick skin, and try to be kind... but do not endure abuse. If a situation escalates, it is ok

to block someone on social media, walk away, ask someone to leave, or call security or the police.

7. Dealing with unhappy Querents

Querents unhappy with the results of a reading sometimes respond with disbelief that borders on anger. Displaying consistent confidence and maintaining a relaxed body language can help. It's easy to doubt yourself in these moments. But remember that the cards show us both the dark and light. It can be challenging to listen to the message in the card's story. Remind yourself to have compassion. A negative response is most often rooted in the Querent's fear.

8. Playing where you don't belong.

Respecting the greatest good means that you have some job responsibility as a Tarot reader. Unless you are a trained and licensed medical professional, your Querent might need medical or psychological help you can't provide. It is advisable to strongly encourage Querents to seek the support they need from the correct source.

Tarot readings lose their magic(k) when a Querent asks about something outside the professional scope of a reader. Unless you are a licensed medical professional it is not appropriate to tell a Querent that they are pregnant or when they will die, even though these are frequent questions Querent's ask.

9. Handling "scary" cards.

There's a thin line for some people between healthy exercise and anxiety. If your Querent is overly stressed out because you pulled the TOWER CARD ... remind them they are in the driver seat. Help them refocus with positive manifesting techniques by suggesting journaling, vision boards, personal affirmations, etc.)

10. Forgetting to have fun.

Relax and have fun! Tarot is a beautiful way to get to know yourself and others on a deeper and more connected level.

Tarot reading can forge lasting relationships and healthy conversations that will stand the test of time.
